These are brought into school at parents / students own risk and are not to be used in school time.


School Admissions Reminder

Further section 278 roadworks B4084 Drakes Broughton

There will be further road works to complete the section 278 developer works on the B4084 near Stonebow Road, Drakes Broughton. This is because the work scheduled during the end of last term and summer holidays was not completed due to workforce and material shortages (resurfacing and white lining). Work will continue between 15th to 20th November 2021. The advance notice should assist you in planning your travel time to school.

Road Safety

Please can we ask you to remind your child to cross at the crossing patrol provided and not at the top of the school drive or other points on Stonebow Road. Also when walking to school, please be vigilant for concealed driveways.

Children should also not be dropped off outside the school / First School playground where there are double yellow lines, even for a very short time or if the crossing patrol is being used. This is both dangerous for the children and other drivers.

RECEPTION

- School house coloured t-shirt

FIRST SCHOOL (Years 1-2)

- School house coloured t-shirt
- Navy blue shorts
- Spare socks
- School navy sweatshirt or plain Blue/black sweatshirt and tracksuit for cold weather
- Black plimsolls for all children in Year 1 & 2

FIRST SCHOOL (Years 3-4)

- School house coloured t-shirt
- Navy blue shorts
- Spare socks
- Navy sweatshirt or plain Blue/black sweatshirt and tracksuit for cold weather
- Trainers for Years 3 & 4

MIDDLE SCHOOL (Years 5-7)

- School house coloured t-shirt
- Navy blue shorts
- Optional games skirt or skorts (cannot be worn for gym lessons)
- Spare socks
- Navy sweatshirt or plain Blue/black sweatshirt and tracksuit for cold weather
- Trainers for Years 5,6 & 7

In addition, children in Middle School will need football boots/hockey boots, long socks and shin pads for outdoor games activities after half term. We also strongly recommend that children in Years 5, 6, & 7 have a mouth guard for hockey and rugby. Hair should always be tied up.

MEDICAL

If your child has an inhaler, it must be taken to the P.E. lessons. Please check they are in date and in school at all times.

JEWELLERY

NO jewellery can be worn during PE and earrings must be removed. This is necessary in the interests of safety and parents of younger children should consider the implications of this when deciding whether to have their children's ears pierced or not. If ears have recently been pierced, tape to cover the studs temporarily should be supplied from home.

Even if children are not actively participating in their P.E. or games lesson, they are usually expected to change into their kit.

Neighbourhood Matters

The **Safer Schools PCSO | South Worcestershire Harm Hub | West Mercia Police** have a new system to interact with its communities and have ask us share with all our parents:

The new system, called Neighbourhood Matters, enables residents, businesses and community groups across Herefordshire, Worcestershire, Shropshire and Telford to find out more about what is happening in their local community. It also gives them the opportunity to contact police officers and local policing teams directly so they can raise any concerns and provide feedback.

It is a free service and those who sign up can choose to receive news and appeals, local crime information and crime prevention advice via a number of different channels.

Assistant Chief Constable Rachel Jones, said: "We are delighted to launch Neighborhood Matters as a key part of our Local Policing and Community Charter. The new messaging service will help us to work more closely with the public, build strong community relationships and both reduce and prevent crime.

"Intelligence received from our communities is vital in preventing and detecting crime and anti-social behaviour. Neighbourhood Matters will be another mechanism that people can use to pass on information and concerns, speak directly to local teams and keep up-to-date with policing in their area. By working together to share information we can make a real difference."

The messages people receive will be targeted and based on their location and preferences selected by each individual. The public can sign up for local updates from their neighbourhood policing team, or join a number of specialised community interest groups such as Business Watch, wildlife crime and crime prevention.
